



Dress Code / Behaviour Code

The Archer Hotel provides a comfortable environment where patrons are able to enjoy their surroundings without the disruption of others, who may be inappropriately dressed or behave in an unacceptable manner. To ensure patron compliance with these principles, standards have been set for dress and behaviour. Patrons are advised to carry valid photo identification (no student identification is accepted; current passports, Australian drivers licenses or Victorian keypass accepted only) with them at all times whilst on the premises. The venue has the ability to refuse expired or damaged ID.

Dress Code

The Archer Hotel requires a neat and tidy standard of dress whilst in the venue. Therefore:

- Patrons must wear footwear at all times
- Patrons must wear appropriate upper body clothing at all times
- No ripped, torn or unruly soiled clothing or footwear is permitted
- No singlets or muscle shirts permitted after 8pm
- No hats/caps or head wear is permitted after 8pm
- No group/gang patches or insignia are permitted at any time
- No street wear permitted after 8pm
- No rubber soled thongs permitted after 8pm
- Patrons without adequate clothing or footwear will be refused entry
- No tracksuits or gym wear at any times, including runners

Behaviour Code

Management, service staff and security personnel of The Archer Hotel support the responsible service of alcohol at the venue to ensure that patrons do not become unduly intoxicated and subsequently, initiate anti-social issues for the hotel and surrounding community.

- Patrons who are unduly intoxicated, abusive, threatening or quarrelsome, will be refused service of alcohol and may be asked to leave the premises
- Management, service staff and security personnel reserve the right under the South Australian Liquor Act (1997) to refuse entry to the hotel or refuse service to any patron at any time.

Management reserves the right to amend these standards at any time without notice. Patrons are advised that failure to comply with staff requests in regards to dress standards and patron behaviour may result in refusal of entry or possible eviction from the premises. The Archer Hotel encourages patrons to socialize responsibly.
